

## **Buncombe County Economic Services**

<u>Veteran Services</u> - Veteran Services offers a range of services for our nation's veterans, service members, and their families including: burial benefits, disability benefits, health care, life insurance, dependent & survivor benefits, education & training, home loans, and vocational rehabilitation & training. <u>Medicaid</u> - Medicaid is a health insurance program for individuals and families who cannot afford medical costs.

- Medicaid for Adults Adult Medicaid programs can provide assistance to individuals age 65 or
  older. Medical assistance is also accessible for those who are either blind or disabled. Services
  are available to pay for medically necessary nursing home care for patients in skilled or
  intermediate care nursing homes. Services are also available for patients in medically necessary
  intermediate care facilities for people with developmental disabilities. Individuals who have
  Medicare coverage may be eligible to have their Medicare premiums paid by Medicaid.
- Medicaid Programs for Families and Children Family Medicaid programs can provide
  assistance to children 18 and under, parents or other caretakers/relatives with children up to 18
  years, pregnant women, and young adults ages 19 and 20.

Food and Nutrition Services - Formerly known as Food Stamps, Food and Nutrition Services is the primary source of nutrition assistance for millions of low-income households monthly. Benefits are issued on EBT (Electronic Benefits Transfer) cards and can be used to purchase food items from retail grocery stores and farmers markets. Certain authorized retail stores can also accept EBT payments for online food purchases.

<u>Special Assistance</u> - An assistance payment to eligible individuals who reside in licensed domiciliary homes, rest homes or family care homes. With this program, Medicaid is also provided to help pay medical bills.

Special Assistance In Home

- Provides a cash supplement to low-income individuals who are at risk of entering a residential facility. Provides additional support services and income to individuals who would prefer to live at home. The case managers work directly with the recipients, families and other caregivers to develop a care plan that enables the recipient to live at home.

<u>Emergency Assistance</u>- Emergency funds paid directly to providers for things such as rent and utilities for families experiencing a short-term financial crisis due to unforeseen circumstances.

<u>General Assistance</u> – A program to help resolve eligible crises. The program is often used to pay for medication, utility and rent assistance, or training associated with other DHHS programs.

**Energy Assistance** – A number of programs are available to assist with heating or cooling costs.

<u>Child Care Subsidy</u> - Subsidized child care is a program funded through State and Federal dollars to assist parents with the cost of child care.

<u>Child Support</u> - Buncombe County Child Support provides the following services: locating non-custodial parents, establishing paternity, establishing support orders, enforcing the support orders and modification of existing orders. These services are available to anyone who needs help to ensure that the children receive the financial support from both parents. Skills Training and Employment Program

- If you are a Food and Nutrition Services recipient in

Buncombe County and under the age of 60, the STEP

program can help you find a job, get a better job, obtain skills

training, or earn a GED at no cost to you.

<u>Work First</u> - Work First Family Assistance provides parents with cash assistance, short-term training, and other supportive services needed to empower and assist customers in securing employment to promote self-sufficiency. Other families caring for their relative children can also receive services and support.

Housing Assistance - The COVID Housing Relief Program provides financial assistance for housing and utilities to Buncombe residents who have lost income due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Eligible individuals may qualify for past due rent, mortgage, and utility payments as well as assistance with current payments.
